


(IAWS) is organizing the XVII National Conference on the theme of 'Women's Studies and Women's Movements: Challenges and Resilience' in collaboration with Government College for Women, Thiruvananthapuram. The IAWS National Conference will be held in Kerala for the second time after 39 years. The conference aims to encourage discussions and reflections on the value and growth of women's/gender studies in higher education and its role in promoting justice and equality for women in India.

About the XVII IAWS Conference

IAWS organizes a national conference every three years on critical issues of contemporary concern. These conferences have garnered significant attention from the academic community as well as media, activists, policymakers, and leaders for foregrounding extensive discussion on key issues of gender concerns on the public agenda. These conferences have contributed to the creation, dissemination, and preservation of genderrelated knowledge. The presence of South Asian scholars of women's studies has been a distinctive feature of these conferences and has enabled the linkage of local women's studies scholarship to the global. Around 1000 persons attend the conference in total, including teachers, students, scholars, development and media practitioners, state representatives, activists, and others. The XVIth conference was held in Delhi in January 2020 in collaboration with National Law University Delhi on the theme "Constitutional Principles in the 21st Century India: Visions for Emancipation".

The XVIIth IAWS conference is proposed to be held in Thiruvananthapuram, the capital city of Kerala, the state that has a continuous legacy of movements and struggles for women's rights, and now has become the hub for development and cultural organizations working for women's empowerment. This conference, "Women's Studies and Women's Movements: Challenges and Resilience," aims to engage in critical and creative ways to reimagine Women's Studies as an academic discipline and the role of Women's movements in challenging current frontiers of knowledge and action. It aims to provide focus, direction, and clarity to achieve the objectives of gender justice.

A continued dialogue between the women's movement and women's studies is crucial for understanding and resisting the dispossession and violence in women's lives. By examining challenges and resilience through this lens, we hope to find the long-awaited answer to the question: what is to be done?

The conference aims to foster dialogues and discussions that bridge the gap between knowledge bases and struggles, encompassing social, political, economic, and cultural contexts, as well as the axes of power that shape patriarchy. The conference will address critical issues in education, health, and labour policies, while also exploring topics related to peace and ecology. The conference features 5 plenaries that will delve into core themes, along with 10 parallel subtheme sessions that will facilitate a wide range of paper presentations. Furthermore, there will be various panel discussions on regional and contemporary issues, audio-visual screenings of films & documentaries, as well as diverse cultural programs and exhibitions. A special plenary will bring together distinguished scholars, activists, and artists from across Asia to collaboratively address key concerns. Participation in the conference presents an opportunity to refine our critical perspectives and mobilize for the movement and struggle



About IAWS

The Indian Association for Women's Studies (IAWS) is a professional body, registered under the Societies' Registration Act, having membership of more than 2500, drawn from a diverse community of academics, researchers, students, policy analysts, activists, social workers, media persons, practitioners working on gender issues and others. IAWS also has institutional members mainly from universities and institutes.

The IAWS came into existence through the resolution of the first National Conference on Women's Studies in 1981, held at SNDT University, Mumbai. This historic conference identified women's studies as a 'critical perspective' to be integrated into all disciplines and the need for universities to initiate activities focusing on women's struggle for equality in independent India through research, teaching, and other interactive platforms. To further these aims, the conference resolved to set up the Indian Association for Women's Studies (IAWS) which was registered as a membership-based organisation in 1982, with the support of two founding institutions namely, The SNDT Women's University, Mumbai, and CWDS, New Delhi. In 2022, IAWS completed

Since its inception in 1982, it is engaged in fostering the development of Women's Studies within and beyond the higher educational institutions. It conducts various activities such as national and regional conferences, supporting research studies,

It undertakes independent and collaborative activities with Universities, Women's studies / Gender studies centers and other institutions/ organisations to promote discussion on women in emerging fields including the fields of citizenship, legal rights, and environment. IAWS is the only platform bringing together those doing women's / gender studies in universities and colleges, in democratic organizations, in state and non-governmental bodies in the development sector, and in media and arts, and this has impacted the widespread and diverse expansion of women's / gender studies across India.

The activities are coordinated by an Executive Committee, elected every three years by its members.
